# OUR PROGRAMS & SERVICES

## RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMS

Learning to thrive in a caring environment

### WINGS:

**Help for the Abused/Neglected**  
Trauma therapy specific for youth that have been abused and/or neglected. This program gives youth a safe place to recover and relearn social skills like appropriate boundaries and roles within a family.

### PASSAGES:

**Passage Way to Success**  
Prepares teens to age out of foster care. This program teaches teens practical skills needed for independent living. It also includes enrollment into our Vocational Tech Program to help teens learn trades and job skills for future employment opportunities.

### CONNECTIONS:

**Mental Health and Behavior Stabilization**  
Structured care for youth that need additional support. This program includes a psychiatric evaluation and intensive med review. Staff to youth ratio is 1:3.

## ADOPTION AND FOSTER CARE SERVICES

Helping create the heart and soul of family

The goal of foster care is to reunite families when possible. Eagle Village manages cases and works with biological families for reunification whenever possible. In situations where parental rights have been terminated, we work to find adoption matches. We also recruit, license, and train foster care families.

## ADDITIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Spaces and accommodations for community group events

### VICTORS EDGE:

For athletic teams, schools, corporate groups and organizations that want to take advantage of our expertise to increase their unity, change their culture, and learn how to strategize for success.

### EVENTS AND RETREATS:

Meeting spaces, overnight accommodations and adventure facilities for groups from churches to football teams to band camps and other organizations that need a large space for gathering.

## INTERVENTION SERVICES

Provides parents respite and solution options for youth in crisis

## CAMP INTERVENTION SERVICES

Discovering potential, no matter the person

### YOUTH & FAMILY CHALLENGE WEEKENDS:

Short-term intervention/respite programs. These weekends are scheduled year-round and provide experiential-based activities and therapy that teach skills such as communication, boundaries, conflict resolution, and respect.

### SPECIALIZED SUMMER CAMPS:

Helps youth struggling to manage their emotions or engaging in risky behaviors. Our camps for youth ages 9-17 use wilderness therapy and natural consequences to teach decision-making skills, better communication, and ways to manage emotions.

## ASSESSMENT CENTER

Providing the answers you need

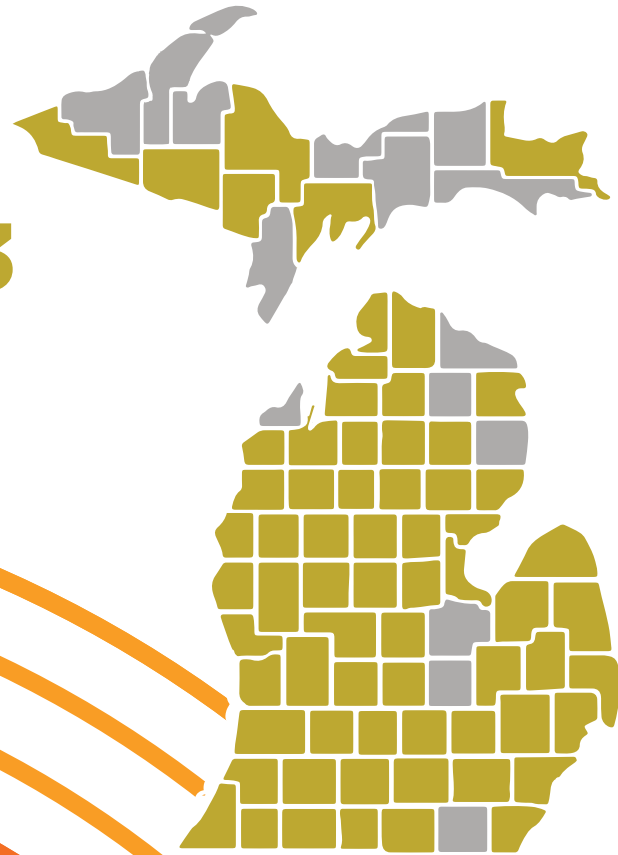
### PROGRAM STARTED IN SEPTEMBER, 2017

This 30-90 day program comprehensively reviews the history and current well-being of boys and girls ages 8-17 who suffer from mental health and behavior issues. Each child leaves with a prescribed course of action that will help stabilize them in their home environment as quickly as possible.

# FORMER CAMPER'S PERSPECTIVE

## ERICK'S STORY

"They called us 'latch key kids' where we'd get out of school and let ourselves into the house and try to find whatever we could to eat and the next day grab our clothes and go off to school again," remembers Erick Forshee, a former camper at Eagle Village.

That was everyday life for Erick growing up. Without positive mentors in his life to guide him, it's not surprising that Erick began getting into trouble. In 7th grade, Erick's probation officer sent him to one of Eagle Village's specialized summer camps, designed to help youth who are exhibiting behavior issues. There, Erick met people who changed his perspective and attitude.

"The counselors stuck with me," he says. "It made me want to be a mentor to others. I think, even at an early age, I interacted with them so well and felt like their buddy. And I think it helped me with my friends because I went to so many different schools when I was a kid because I was bounced around I didn't have a lot of friends. The way they interacted with me, I think they gave me an avenue to interact with other people and try and be their buddy."

Now an adult, Erick's life is completely different.

"I actually have a family," he says of his wife, 3 sons, and wonderful in-laws. Erick vows that his children will never go through what he went through. "Maybe some of that is because I made it to this camp."

"I was here 30-some years ago and these things are still happening to kids," Erick says. "They still have to come to a place like this. And maybe it's not because they were in trouble, but because their family doesn't have anything to do with them or they don't have a family at all. And to see that, and to see where I am today, I hope that for them. And I know, some of them, they might not end up getting that."

"I have no excuses for getting in trouble like I did; but, I know for a fact that you're not born with morals and values. They're taught. And, until someone taught me ... I didn't know right from wrong," Erick says. "And, luckily for me, I had some good mentors along the way and people that sent me to camp."

# FORMER RESIDENT'S PERSPECTIVE

## CALLIE'S STORY

Making a decision to change is never easy, but that's exactly what Callie Cheek, a former resident of Eagle Village, did in 2015. Callie had just been adopted for the 2nd time, but was having a hard time at home. "I was afraid to, I guess you'd say, let them love me," Callie says.

Due to her past trauma, Callie struggled with her anger and emotions. As a result, she had been through a few programs to try and help her, including a couple of mental hospitals. Finally, in the 2nd mental hospital she was in, she found a trauma program.

"That's when I realized, like, I did want to get better because I could get through this because there were things out there and options for me that could help me," Callie remembers. "And I didn't want to just spend a week working through it. I needed to spend a longer amount of time, so my family and I found Eagle Village."

Callie was determined to work through her past trauma, and that determination was quickly noticed by the staff at Eagle Village.

"She came in ready to work and that was something we don't see a lot, so we knew there was something very special about her," says Eagle Village employee Renee Frahm.

Callie advanced all the way through Eagle Village's program and got to Heart Stage, the highest level in her program. To reach Heart Stage, she had to do a presentation in front of Eagle Village staff describing the changes she had made and her outlook for the future.

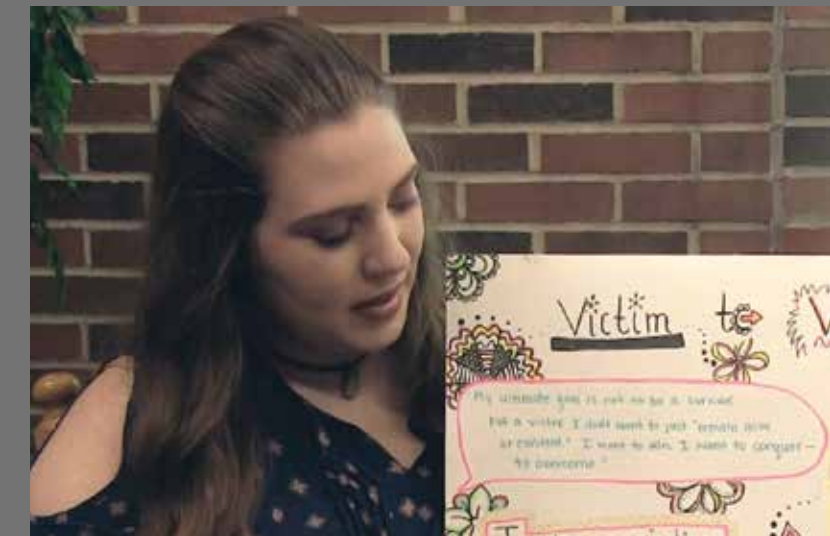
"I didn't want to be a victim anymore, and I didn't want to just be a survivor because by definition a survivor is someone who just remains alive or existent, and I wanted to be more than that," she explains. "And a victor is someone who overcomes, who conquers."

Today, Callie is working toward a degree in Social Work at Western Michigan University.

"I always tell people that I want to help people the way that people have helped me, and when I say that, I'm talking about Eagle Village," she says. "I want to help people the way that Eagle Village helped me."

## 1. A Spiritual Foundation

Eagle Village has a spiritual foundation that directs us to value each and every person that sets foot on our campus. We also believe a spiritual foundation provides a rock for the kids that we serve regardless of where they go after Eagle Village.

## 2. Transportation on Behalf of the Kids

Our road warriors took kids to doctor's appointments, to court dates, to family visits. They drove hours to pick up kids' family units so they could participate in skill building and family therapy.

The Eagle Funds covers ALL of that. Transportation is an important part of the care we provide — whether we're taking kids to tour colleges, traveling with them to do community service projects, taking kids across the state for home visits, or bringing their families here for therapy, it's all part of Eagle Village going above and beyond for our kids and families.

## 3. Family Involvement

We can treat and help the kids in our care through wilderness experiences, hands-on learning, activity-based and traditional therapy, and by modeling healthy relationships. When the whole family gets help, we have a chance to really impact the community.

**FOR THIS REASON, WE MAKE THERAPY FOR THE WHOLE FAMILY A PRIORITY.**

One way we involve the family is by holding monthly Legacy Weekends, which include therapy for the whole family for a weekend. We drive to pick up entire families, give them a room in our on-campus motel to stay in, and feed the entire family at no cost — just so they can participate in experiences designed to help the whole family succeed.



## 4. A Safe Place to Live

Kids who stay with us at Eagle Village come from a variety of backgrounds. Some have experienced neglect and abuse and some have been in multiple foster care homes or residential facilities.

**WE WANT EAGLE VILLAGE TO FEEL LIKE HOME TO ALL OF THEM.**

That means we want our homes and buildings to be clean, up-to-date, safe and welcoming.

## 5. Intervention Scholarships

When kids are struggling behaviorally and emotionally, parents can feel helpless. They don't know how to help or where to go to get help. Unchecked, small issues can grow into big problems and escalate quickly. Intervention is the answer. But to get help, families need the resources to do so.

## 6. A Practical Education

Business experts have spent the last two years talking about a shortage of workers in the skilled trades. 6,600 skilled trade jobs are left unfilled in Michigan each year. Meanwhile, kids in foster care are struggling to attend and finish college.
