

- 1 cup butter , softened
- 1 teaspoon <u>va</u>nilla
- 2½cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- ½ teaspoon cream of tartar
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- For topping: Cinnamon & Sugar

INSTRUCTIONS 🖈



- 1. In large bowl, mix powdered sugar & butter together.
- Mix in egg & vanilla until smooth.
- Stir in flour, baking soda, cream of tartar & cinnamon until well blended. Cover & refrigerate for 1 hour or until firm.
- 4. Preheat oven to 375°F (350°F if using dark or nonstick sheet)
- 5. Divide dough in half. On lightly floured surface, roll half of dough at a time to ¼ inch thick.
- Cut with 2-inch star-shaped cookie cutter.
- Place on cookie sheets, 1 inch apart. Sprinkle with a mixture of cinnamon & sugar.
- 8. Bake 7 to 8 minutes or until light golden.

Each of the shows were followed by house tours led by our youth. For our kids, this gives them a chance to learn how to properly host guests in their

This opportunity allows us to create a positive experience for our kids - while showcasing Eagle Village's past, present, and future to our visitors, and how we give our kids a second chance at a normal childhood.

A couple asked if they could support our youth having the opportunity to experience the joy of giving. It was such a thoughtful idea that they have now made it happen for the third year. Many of our youth have not received Christmas presents, so we work hard to make sure they do. They also haven't had a chance to give one away. The Secret Santa Shop gives them the chance to think about
