NOVEMBER IS NATIONAL ADOPTION MONTH

In the State of Michigan, there are approximately 10,000 children who are in the foster care system. Children enter foster care when their parents are not able to keep them safe from significant abuse and/or neglect. Eagle Village works with these children and families to ensure a child does not remain in foster care long-term.

According to Eagle Village Foster Care & Adoption Coordinator, Kathy Lockhart, when children enter foster care, "The 1st goal is to reunify the child with their parents. If that is not possible and the child becomes eligible for adoption, the foster family can be considered as a forever placement for the child." She added, "We encourage families who are interested in adopting to consider Foster Care to Adopt."

Every year, approximately 2,100 children become eligible for adoption through the Michigan foster care system. Families who are interested in learning more about adoption can contact:
