The outcome is children who do not feel safe in their homes and have lost trust in the adults who should be protecting them. They live with the fear of not knowing what each day will bring. This population has a high rate of homelessness which leads to a life of lost potential, unrealized value and living without hope.

Eagle Village is solution focused to meet Michigan's mental health issues. We use trauma informed therapy, occupational therapy, experiential activities and create individual treatment plans to help each youth work through their trauma. Eagle Village is committed to improving lives and futures. We want each child to realize their value. A concept we teach is that their past doesn't determine their future. Our goal is to create intentional paths and teach them the skills to help them navigate life; one of change, determination and hope.

HE WANTED TO KNOW THAT SOMEONE WOULD CATCH HIM

Cody came to Eagle Village when he was 8 years old. He was a very sad and confused little boy, having been adopted by a family and then removed from that home because of abuse and neglect. He was moved through four foster homes before arriving at our Eagle Village residential program. When he arrived, he kept repeating, "I want to be homeless and I don't want a family". We learned that when he was with his family he would run away from home and no one would look for him. Clearly "family" brought him great pain and resentment.



Cody was cautious and tested staff to see if we really cared about him. One of the most memorable moments is when he climbed a tree. After he realized that we were not going to let him fall; he climbed down into the arms of Ben, a staff member, and did not want to let go. Cody knew he was safe and valued.

"Cody believes he is worthless, I tell him he is worth it." - Benjamin Brandt, Eagle Village staff

This is a big step for a boy who has been in so many different placements. Cody wants to feel what children typically do, that they can trust the adults caring for them. He wants to know that someone will catch him.

Our Eagle Village tagline is "Where Potential Soars". When a child feels valued, safe, and genuinely cared for, they can thrive. We walk with them through their trauma to heal and develop coping skills; helping them find a new path for life and to see the strength in their resilience.



Cody has made great progress. He loves walking through the woods with staff, playing with toy trucks, and just enjoyed celebrating his birthday. He requested and received strawberry cake with strawberry icing, making it his first real birthday celebration. Cody is beginning to understand what a family and home should be.

JOY OF THE SEASON

SEASON For many of us, the Christmas season is filled with traditions and joy, celebrating the incredible gift of Christ. But many children in residential care do not have positive memories of Christmas. We work to help our

memories of Christmas. We work to help our youth through difficult emotions and to build experiences that give them the Joy of the Season.

The first JOY of the Season was the Many Days of Christmas. The 10 days prior to Christmas, gifts were left at each house for youth to enjoy when they got home from school. We thank those who provided great gifts - such as, gingerbread house kits, handmade hats, and games.

The second JOY of the Season is our Village Christmas program, a tradition of inviting guests to our campus to celebrate our residential youth. The Christmas Program is followed by guests visiting youth houses to see their themed decorations and receive a homemade ornament.

The third JOY of the Season is our "Santa Shop". This gives each youth the opportunity to experience the joy of giving by selecting a gift for a housemate. This tradition was created by the generosity of a donor couple who also volunteers as Santa and Mrs. Claus.

The final JOY of the Season is to plant the seed of what home should feel like during Christmas. Less than half of our youth have family to spend the holiday with. Celebrating this special holiday with them and watching them open a wrapped Christmas present, possibly for the first time, is an incredible joy of the season for us.
